RIBOLLA GIALLA DOC

One of the native vines of Friuli with the most ancient historical references, it is widespread in Colli di Rosazzo, thanks to the high quality wine it produces. Known for its fine, delicate perfume, this wine boasts a good level of natural acidity that makes it fresh and elegant.

Grapes: Ribolla Gialla 100% **Origin:** Oleis di Manzano, company-owned grapes
Terrain Type: Marly and eocenic **Altitude:** 120 – 150 m above sea level **Cultivation method:** Guyot **Vineyard density:** 4.500 vines per hectare **Grape yield:** circa 7.0 tons per hectare

Winemaking: The de-stemmed grapes undergo a soft squeezing process. Alcoholic fermentation occurs in steel containers maintained at controlled temperatures. Once fermentations are finished, the wine rests in yeasts for at least 4 months before bottling.

The Wine: This straw-colored wine boasts a mid-range level of intensity. Its clean floral scents suggest melon and a light hint of citrus. To the palate, it's clear-cut, very fresh and flavorful, coherently characterized by the citrus scents perceived by the nose.

Combinations: It makes an excellent aperitif and proves a great match for salty sandwiches and starters in general. It's also ideal for accompanying delicate first courses such as *trofie* pasta with pesto sauce and risotto with herbs.
Grapes : Ribolla Gialla (100.00%)

FRIULI VENEZIA GIULIA

Friuli-Venezia Giulia is the northeastern Italian region. The region spans a wide variety of climates and landscapes from the mild Mediterranean climate in the south to Alpine continental in the north.

Once part of the Venetian Republic and with sections under the influence of the Austro-Hungarian Empire for some time, the wines of the region have noticeable Slavic and Germanic influences. Nearly 62% of the wine produced in the region falls under a DOC designation. The area is known predominantly for its white wines which are considered some of the best examples of Italian wine in that style.

Along with the Veneto and Trentino-Alto Adige/Südtirol, the Friuli-Venezia Giulia forms the Tre Venezie wine region which ranks with Tuscany and Piedmont as Italy's world class wine regions.
